### We are back!

I would like to start with a thank you to everyone who attended the topic Launch Pad in classrooms across the school this morning; what a wonderful time we had.

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### **Uniform**

I have reviewed the children's uniform this week and there are a number of things I would like to bring to your attention.

Firstly, thank you, to those who are weaning our smart new uniform. It really does look great on, presents a wonderful image of the school and a creates a real sense of respect in our community from the children.

- FS1—Y6 children must have jumper or cardigan from the new supplier by January 2018.
- Logo T-Shirts make our uniform as smart as possible and wearing these would support that part of the ethos and values of the school.
- Fleece Jackets are not replacements for jumpers or cardigans but an optional item which is smart and practical for all children to wear outside on the school playground.
- The sun hat should be purchased for children in EYU, FS1 and FS2. Other children are welcome to wear this hat and in the summer months will provide sun protection.
- We have a PE uniform for children FS2—Y6 which is a school logo t-shirt and school hoodie.
- It is important that you order now for the full change over of uniform in January 2018 as items are individually prepared by 'Initially Yours' and then posted to Mount Pleasant.
- Logo jumpers and cardigans which are not from 'Initially Yours' and those not displaying the Mount Pleasant Logo are not part of our school uniform and children are not
  permitted to wear them with effect January 2018.
- This represents no change to our uniform policy which also states children must have school logo book bag and for those in FS2-Y6, a school logo PE bag.

It is advised that you use your civilian address in order to register eg 18 Hamilton Rise, Mount Pleasant Complex, Falkland Islands rather than BFPO 655

Subs will be £25 per term and will cover the Girlguiding annual membership subscription, snacks, activities and day-to-day running of the Unit.

A one-off sub of  $\pounds 40$  must be paid by new Rainbows/Brownies for their first term. Rainbows will receive a Tabard (uniform) and Brownies will receive a Becoming a Brownie and Brownie Adventure Book.

Miss Schofield (Brown Owl) will advise wrt Brownie uniform.

Subs for Rainbows/Brownies who are joining from a previous UK or Overseas Unit will be £25 per term.
