Turban Day

Manpreet Lally has kindly given his own time to come into school during his posting to MPC, to share his love of Bhangra Dancing through an afterschool club, and to talk to the children about his Sikh beliefs. This has greatly enhanced the children's learning about Sikhism which is prescribed in the MoD Schools Agreed Syllabus from FS2 to Year 6.

Manpreet has organised a station wide 'Turban Day' (and event which is held annually across the world) to celebrate the values of Sikhism and share awareness of them with the wider community. I am delighted to say that he has arranged for our school to be involved in this event, and will be in school on Thursday 5th October to talk to children about Sikhism and them tie a Turban for each child and present them with a Kara. After lunch, the whole school will walk along the corridor to the church where other members of MPC will gather in this effort to raise awareness of Sikhism and celebrate equality and diversity in our community.
