Staying Healthy

Schools and nurseries are common sites for transmission of infections. Micro-organisms such as bacteria, viruses and fungi are everywhere and commonly do not cause infection (and can even be beneficial). However, some do cause infection resulting in symptoms such as fever and sickness. Many diseases can spread before the individual shows any symptoms at all (during the infectious period). For example a pupil with chickenpox is infectious to others 1 to 2 days before the rash appears

Infection prevention and control measures aim to interrupt the cycle of infection by promoting the routine use of good standards of hygiene so that transmission of infection is reduced overall. This is usually through:

- good hand washing
- making sure the environment is kept clean

Prompt exclusion is essential to preventing the spread of infection in childhood settings, and a procedure for contacting parents or carers when children become ill at school is in place.

When pupils are suffering from infectious diseases they should be excluded from school on medical grounds for the minimum period recommended.

With this newsletter I have printed the exclusion table from Public Health England which applies to schools and child care settings.

Show Racism the Red Card is an organisation that works in schools and other educational settings throughout the UK to offer a whole range of educational training, workshops, resources and activities, all designed to educate young people and adults about the causes and the consequences of racism.

I am delighted to confirm that pupils in KS1 and KS2 will be able to experience a day each with Show Racism the Red Card during the week of 23rd April when we will be visited by Francis Duku and Shona Tabeth Chitate-Samuriwo.

The main workshop aims are:

- To educate young people about the causes and consequences of racism and to explore the various forms racism can take.
- To empower young people to challenge racism in the communities in which they live, providing them with relevant knowledge and information to enable them to do this.
- To help young people prepare to play an active role as citizens in an increasingly multicultural society.
- To enable young people to develop good relationships and respect the differences between people, regardless of their ethnicity, faith, culture or nationality.

Key Stage Two children will also enjoy a 'Football and Fitness' session. The sessions puts an emphasis on teamwork and supporting each other; prizes are given out for enthusiasm and participation.

This opportunity is being made available to all MOD Schools and is funded centrally by MOD Directorate of Children and Young People.
