PE and Swimming

This week I spent time in PE lessons and have recently spent time observing swimming lessons. In the different P.E. lessons I observed pupils working together to create fitness routines, learning basketball skills and developing their travelling and running skills.

In swimming I observed pupils from FS2 to Year 6 enjoying learning new skills while developing their water confidence skills. Due to our unique partnership with BFSAI we are able to book the pool for use every Tuesday afternoon and thanks to our dedicated teachers who spent 2 weekends attending swimming teacher certification lessons we are able to include an extensive swimming programme as part of the curriculum at Mount Pleasant School. In comparison to State Schools in England, this is significantly more swimming than is offered by the majority of schools who tend to take older pupils for a term or two in one academic year.

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Enrichment

At Mount Pleasant School we have regular enrichment opportunities outside school time, this year we have offered 10 different enrichment programmes for pupils. Each teacher gives up some of their own time to run these additional activities, for pupils to enjoy something that we do not normally offer in school time, and unlike many schools in England we do not currently make a charge for any of our after school activities. Research has shown that a popular school by a RAF base in the UK charges for many activities at rates between £35 and £130 per term and a second such school charges for all activities starting at £15.

This year there has been an inviting range of planned activities, that pupils requested via the school council, which have included Digital Animation, Paper Craft, Craft and Hobby Club, Creative writing, Football Club, Stay and Play, Maths Magic and Hover Rings. In addition, to enable children to undertake more than one opportunity, we have run the school Choir at 12:30 on Wednesday lunch times.

If you have skill or talent that you can share with our pupils in a club or activity please let the school office know and we can look to offer this in enrichment times.

If you have a school supporting business in the UK, where you normally run a chargeable after school activity, or would like to volunteer we would be very interested in talking to you about establishing a partnership to offer your activity through school. In addition to our existing after school clubs.

We also have enrichment on Friday afternoons where we offer a range of activities including, in this half term, the opportunity to learn Makaton, Art, Cross Stitch and Outdoor Games.
