#### School Uniform

Thank you for your continued support of our uniform policy. Mount Pleasant School has a full uniform policy which supports our learning values and our work on building a learning community.

#### Daily uniform (FS1-Y6)

School jumper —uniform shop Required, White polo shirt, School Fleece —uniform shop Optional, Grey trousers/skirt-self purchase Required, Sturdy black school shoes—self purchase Required

#### PE Kit (FS2-Y6)

Burgundy T-shirt—uniform shop or self source Required, Burgundy (School) Hoody (PE use only)- uniform shop or self source Optional, Blue or Black Jogging bottoms - self source Required, Blue or Black Shorts—uniform shop or self purchase Optional, Trainers or plimsolls- self source Required.

#### Swimming Kit (FS2-Y6)

One piece swimsuit- girls- self source Required, Swimming trunks (not baggy swim shorts)- boys- self source Required, Swim cap for children with long hair- self source Required, Towel- self source Required, Goggles- self source Optional but permitted in swimming lessons.

#### Other items

School book bag- uniform shop Required (FS1-Y2), School PE bag- uniform shop or self source, School Baseball cap—uniform shop Optional, School Hi Viz—uniform shop Optional

#### School Governance Committee

MOD Schools do not have a governing body with the same powers as those in England. MOD are the employing body and have responsibility for Mount Pleasant School. Locally there is a School Governance Committee (SGC). The SGC has a critical role in ensuring positive outcomes for pupils in school by working closely with the senior leadership team (SLT) in agreeing priorities for improvement, ensuring accountability, and monitoring and evaluating school performance. The SGC acts in the best interests of all pupils in the school, focussed by the question, 'What difference will this make to the pupils in the school?'. Kat Barnes (COFISU) is the SGC Chair for Mount Pleasant School. We are also lucky to have an active parent rep—Fergie Cliff who can be contacted by any parent for a chat about school.

## Class Arrangements FS1 and FS2

From 1st October we will open our Foundation Stage 1 and Foundation Stage 2 (Reception) class in the Foundation Stage classroom. Liz Bradbury will be teaching between 1st October and the December holidays. Children in FS2 will be in school between 08:50 and 15:05 and children in FS1 will be in school from 08:50-12:00 (or 13:00). At the start and end of the school day, children should be taken to /picked up from the Foundation Stage Classroom.

After the move of class room, children in FS1 will continue to have time with Mrs Deane and Mrs Brownlee-Pinkerton and those is FS2 will continue to have Mrs Shazell who will move from the Year 1 and 2 classroom to the Foundation Stage room.

From 1st October, children in FS2 will continue to have a PE lesson on Monday and swimming on Tuesday.
