Water, snow and new starters

We had a very unexpected closure day on Tuesday after it was decided to turn off the water supply to school at no notice. I would like to thank everyone for agreeing to collect children swiftly and recognising that not having running hot and cold water is a hygiene risk. The water was back on when we arrived in school on Wednesday and everyone arrived fresh and ready to learn. As a result of the closure Enrichment will start on Tuesday 25th for those who are dancing, learning to play the recorder or staying and playing and will run for three weeks.

Welcome to three new Learning Support Assistants, Pete Bell who will be working in KS2, Liz Davenport who will be working across Nursery and Foundation Stage 1 and 2 and Bernadette Pummell who will be providing additional pupil support, assisting with phonics and will open the school library to children for four lunch times every week.

For the next few days you will see a new face round school, Rowland Bucknill, Assistant Head MoD Schools with responsibility for Inspection and Advice. Rowley will be working with all the school staff to look at learning and standards. Our web site has a section on outcomes and gives you all the information we are required to report about the test results—FS2, Y1, Y2 and Y6. Mount Pleasant School is a very high performing school with children making significant progress during their time in school. We also have a strong PSHE and values programme and work with the children to support transition and change.

I am sure you have seen some developments in our poly tunnel and sensory garden, we are also delighted that our 'Tommy' statue has arrived. Last year children raised funds to pay for the statue and now it is here we are planning some special work as we move towards Remembrance Day in November. If you can lend some time to help dig in the garden or tidy the poly tunnel, please let us know.
