
The Value for May is 'perseverance', we will be looking at how we have to work at and practise things even if we are good at things.

### In EYFS:

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#### In Caracara Class:

This week Caracaras have been very busy comparing the weight of objects. They have been able to explain how they know if an item is heavier or lighter than other items and that when two items 'balance' the weight/mass is equal.


Our Caracara family trees were very interesting, causing quite a stir with discussions about brothers, sisters and cousins; talking about the names of older family members added extra fascination and a really lovely touch to the activity. Thank you to parents who supported us in this. The history of 'coronation chicken/Quorn sandwiches' has been on the 'menu' this week so we are all looking forward to creating our special sandwich!





#### In Falcon Class:

This week, the children have been learning about Henry VIII and how he changed over his reign. The children wrote a character description based on information from both primary and secondary sources. In Art we have started to design our own illuminated letters, looking at colour, line and shape and we have experimented with different shading techniques. In Maths, Year 3 have continued their excellent learning about fractions and are now adding fractions with the same denominator whilst Year 4 have been using a calculator to solve multi step money word problems. In English we have been concentrating on our writing technique, punctuation, spelling and general presentation skills by recapping our SPAG from prior learning before we continue with our Tudor character descriptions. The children have enjoyed tinkering with the series circuits, building different models and experimenting with incomplete and complete circuits, looking at the correct names for the components and making predictions based on their learning last week. They have also created a human circuit and static electricity which proved to be a popular activity.



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#### In Meadowlark Class:

I was another extremely busy week for Year 6 between practising for their SATs, having breaks with biscuits and 'insulting' each other with SPAG terminology.

Our Year 5's had a hands-on week during Maths, estimating, measuring and then converting different units of measurement.

In English, we analysed a balanced argument and looked at the different features that constitute an excellent piece of writing. Do you know the difference between your modal verbs, causal conjunctions and adverbials for opposing views?











## The Queen's Jubilee Event 27th May:

Our plans for the Queens Jubilee event on Friday 27th May are taking shape and we warmly invite families and friends who live in SFA Accommodation to this event.
