In Plover Class:

This week in Nursery we enjoyed listening to and singing along to the book 'Journey home from Grandpa's.'

We looked at and played with plenty of modes of transport, built bumpy roads, washed the bikes outside and vehicles inside, as well as playing traffic light games!

We tried to listen carefully to instructions and enjoyed moving around, beeping our horns when we saw a friend and kept our eyes out for traffic light signals.

In art we made 'Racing Rainbows'. The children were fascinated by the way the paint moved! They discovered that thinner paint moved faster and if you drop a blob of paint on top of another, it spreads and makes patterns and circles.

In music and movement we have also been playing musical instruments with increased control, trying to follow the pulse of a song.





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In Albatross Class:

To end our learning all about friendship and animals we visited Fitzroy Farm. Suzi was very kind and showed us all around the farm. We saw lots of lambs and sheep,

some of us were brave enough to touch them too. We played games at the farm, saw the dogs and fed the chickens too. We had a great time.



This week we are reading the book 'The Something'. We have been digging holes in the mud area, making predictions about

what might be down the hole in the story. We have a role play hole in our classroom and each day we have been guessing what might be inside. We have been able to talk about the story and retell parts of it using pictures and small world figures.

In maths we have been naming circles and triangles. We have been on a shape walk around our outdoor area.

In phonics, FS2 children have been segmenting and blending short words using their phonic knowledge.

Have a great half term.







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
In Caracara Class: This week, Caracara Class have been busy preparing for the penguin party that we had on Thursday. We wrote invitations; made penguin masks; had fun making and decorating biscuits; and designed and drew a table runner. We've also written about our favourite traditional tale in preparation for next term's learning. In maths, we've continued to learn about number bonds in year 1 and related facts and adding 1s in year 2. In computing, we have applied all our skills and learning to create our own algorithm using movement, speech and parallel processing to make a sprite move and talk.











In Falcon Class

Falcons class have finally completed our Viking helmets this week and the children are very proud of the end results. In maths we have continued to look at addition and subtraction of 3 and 4 digit numbers with exchange and regrouping. In English, the children have written their own Monster Hunter's Guide to defeating a Viking monster using some new vocabulary such as outmanoeuvred and consequently. They have included some lovely description to create a sense of challenge and fear. In history, the children have learned how the Anglo-Saxon and Viking era ended in Britain with the Battle of Hastings and the victory of William the Conqueror and in science, they have continued to observe their water cycles to note any changes such as transpiration occurring.







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In Meadowlark Class:

The summer holidays seem like a distant memory and Christmas is around the corner! We've had a jam-packed term, full of learning – please see below a summary of what my amazing students thought about their first term in Meadowlark.



The highlight of my term was painting our propaganda posters because it was really exciting to do. In maths I have learnt how to do long multiplication and long division. Do you know what the difference between a multiple, prime number, factor and common factor are? In computing we have been trying to make a game in Scratch 2 and that was enjoyable because we had to persevere in making our characters do what we told them to do. In recorder club I am learning to play the recorder and it is really fun. Some of the books that we read in class were Goodnight Mr Tom and Fireweed.
