We have had a wonderful first week back in school where it has been a pleasure to see the children settling into their work and enjoying their learning.

As incredible as it sounds, we have already begun our journey of prepping and organising for Christmas! The nativity is well underway, with outfits having been chosen, children having their fittings and the seasonal excitement clearly gathering momentum.

In Plover Class:

We started off the new half-term with a focus on insects, in particular caterpillars and butterflies as the children love learning about animals.

We enjoyed listening to the story called 'The very hungry caterpillar' - which inspired us with plenty of play opportunities!

In music and movement we pretended to be hungry caterpillars and acted out the lifecycle of a butterfly. We made lovely salt dough creations, as well as large process art butterflies in art.

A big highlight was watching a puppet show! The children enjoyed it so much, that they all wanted to 'have a go' and tell their friends various stories using the finger puppets.









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In Albatross Class:

The children have made a great start back to the term. Our learning focus this week was space rockets. We used oil pastels to draw space pictures. In maths we have been using and naming 2d shapes when rocket building.

This terms learning overview has been published on Tapestry.








In Caracara Class:

In English, they have been busy learning the magical language used in fairy tales; in RE they have shared the special people who are important to them and in PSHE, they have been 'Celebrating Difference' by spotting similarities and differences.





In Falcon Class:


This week Falcons have completed our maths work on formal methods of addition and subtraction using the column method. The children have worked on word problems, using their guided reading skills to highlight the relevant information and using this to calculate correctly.

In English we have looked at the indefinite articles a/an and when to use them as well as using collective nouns to describe groups of animals, people and things.


In geography the children have learned about the Northern and Southern Hemispheres and researched information on countries located in these areas as well as on the Equator.

Art this term is focussed on changing states of matter and how this occurs in weather. The children used a variety of mediums to try to create rain, ice, clouds and water effects. They will then choose their favourite method to create a painting of a beach scene later this week.

Our English Text this term is 'Rhythm of the Rain' by Grahame Baker-Smith which looks at the journey of the water in a little boy's fishing jar as it passes from a forest stream out to the ocean and across the world in clouds before falling as rain.







In Meadowlark Class:

In maths this week, we started with our termly topic on fractions. We converted improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa, learnt how to simplify fractions and looked at equivalent fractions.

In English, we finished our unit on war poetry and my students are in the process of rehearsing their poems to prepare for the Remembrance Day service at MPC.

In history we drew a timeline of key events from WWII. We also researched the role that the Falklands played in the South Atlantic with the Battle of the River Plate.

It is that time of the year again! Believe it or not but Christmas is around the corner! We have started 'learning our lines' and rehearsing for our production at the beginning of December.
