

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In Caracara Class:

In maths we have been using hundreds squares and number lines to subtract. We have then been creating our own subtraction number sentences. In geography we have been researching and naming map symbols.



We have been learning about the significance of Remembrance Day. We watched a short video and have been painting poppy pictures and making our own poppies.

It has been a very busy week in Falcons Class. In maths the children have been practising their times tables by re-capping the 3 & 4s and learning tips and tricks to help them learn them. In English the children have written their fabulous setting descriptions based on our book 'Rhythm of the Rain' and I was very impressed by the language they have used along with their use of the grammar taught so far this year. Well done Falcons! In geography, the children have been looking at some key features of the polar regions and compared them to the UK. 








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In Meadowlark Class:






War poetry written by Year 5 & 6 Meadowlark



"They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them."


Laurence Binvon - For The Fallen
