Dear Parents

On Wednesday we tried on all our wonderful costumes and had a full run through of the Landlord's Cat. It went really well and below are a few photos of the rehearsal. We hope you all enjoyed the performance this afternoon.





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In Plover Class:

Glitter has started to make its appearance in nursery, which can only mean one thing: Christmas is coming! The children have started to make plenty of lovely Christmas related decorations and artwork. In continuous provision we explored and played with 'snowflakes' and spoons, scooped and poured water beads. We practiced our scissor skills by cutting and creating pictures with Christmas wrapping paper, wrapped pretend gifts and sang Christmas songs!









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In Albatross Class:

We have continued to use the text Star in the Jar as our book focus. We have all learnt a song about the solar system, created paper plate planets, made large scale planets out of different pieces of material and decorated stars with shiny sequins. We have used chime bars to make sounds and some of us were able to play the first line of Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star. In continuous provision the children have enjoyed using a toy space shuttle, made moon buggies using Lego and made space stations using construction materials.

FS2- In literacy, children have been writing sentences about the story. In maths, the children have been counting inside and outside and writing number sentences to find a total. We conducted an investigation to see how far a star would travel down a piece of plastic pipe and recorded the results. All FS2 children have been excellent in the swimming pool this term and I am proud of how much they have improved.















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In Caracara Class:

What another busy week leading into the Winter/Summer break! We've been learning about and planting bulbs, finding out about 3D shapes, carrying out the dress rehearsal for our Christmas play and going down to Stanley Growers to continue our learning about plants. As you can see, we were exhausted by the end of it all!

In the classroom, the children have started to write their information leaflets and have chosen a wide variety of natural features to write about, from sinkholes to volcanoes. I am very much looking forward to seeing the final products. In maths, the Year 3 children have moved on to long multiplication formal written methods and year 4 are investigating all given factors for numbers. The term in finally beginning to wind down, with our last busy event happening today!
