Dear Parents



Nursery kicked off the week with a flying start and we learned all about kites. Apart from our own designs, we made all sorts of different kites this week, including Japanese 'Koinobori' and beautiful sun-catcher ones that we are proudly displaying in our window! We also did a few colour matching activities as well as wind investigation, by trying to blow different objects on a tray.

Caracara Class have continued to learn about seasons in science. It's a little tricky here so we are still learning how to identify when each season is. We have worked hard in year 1 to use the prefix 'un' and year 2s have been describing using similes. Our building blocks have changed and we are loving the new Kapla! It takes a lot of perseverance and vision to build with these blocks. We would like to say thank you Flt Lt Lucy Heal, for help in transporting this new educational

Falcon Class: In Falcons Class this week, the children have been practising their division and multiplication skills using a range of different techniques and discussing alternative ways to work them out, using what they already know from other areas of their maths learning. In history the children have learned about the importance of the river Nile to ancient Egypt and how the civilisation couldn't have existed without it. In science our focus has been on the harmful effects of UV light and the importance of protecting our skin, particularly with the thin ozone layer over our region. English this week has had a focus on using "a" or "an" depending on the sound following, as well as trying to include as much detail in our sentences as possible using the questions When? Where? Why? How? Our launchpad event was great fun and the children enjoyed making a Falkland Island version of papyrus paper with NAAFI bags, as well as mummifying a tomato. The children will be observing how the tomato changes over the next 40 days.









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In Meadowlark Class:

We've had a busy second week of term and have been hard at work!

In maths this week we looked at ratio and proportion word problems, developing strategies to solve a variety of tasks in real-life context.

In English we started to plan and write a narrative setting, focusing on using similes, metaphors and a range of punctuation.

In science we studied the heliocentric model of the solar system, and looked at the theory of Copernicus. For history we started a fact file on an inspiring astronaut of our choice and in art, we continued to experiment with blending different coloured oil pastels.
