Plover Class:

Nursery had another eventful week with plenty of outdoor learning. We enjoyed getting to know Mr Moore better and shared with him our favourite songs and all the other things we enjoy doing.

Our new Nursery rhyme this week was 'Hot Cross Buns' and our art focus was making and painting different lanterns!









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Albatross Class:

In FS2 and FS1 this week, we have been using the text 'Superbat' to enhance our learning. We have used different 'superpowers' in our learning such as perseverance and courage.

We have been using water pistols to aim at superheroes and we created artwork using water pistols filled with paint.



We have been looking at magnetic force and felt how magnets attract and repel. We have created shapes and letters out of magnetic blocks.

In literacy, FS2 have been learning facts about bats and writing about them. We have used our phonics to write about the story of the week.









Caracara Class:

Another busy week for the Caracaras! We have started learning about Grace Darling and talked about her daily life compared with ours today. No electricity (so no i-Pads etc) was a huge talking point! In science, we continue with the seasons and, alongside comparing UK and Falklands seasons, we have been thinking about 'What if humans hibernated?' A little tricky for some but it led to some interesting ideas! The children have produced some great work and I am as proud as a peacock of them all!




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Falcon Class:

In Falcons Class this week, the children have been learning about primary and secondary sources of information. In history, they put themselves in the place of Howard Carter as he explored the tomb of Tutankhamun for the first time and explored our own version of the tomb by torchlight. The children then wrote fabulous diary entries of their experience. In math's Year 3 have been dividing with remainders and Year 4 have started to multiply 3-digit numbers by a 1-digit number. In English, they have been writing sentences that 'show not tell' what is happening, by describing the bodies reactions to events rather than telling the reader that the character is excited, or scared. In science, the results of our experiment into how long different SPF sun creams protect our skin, showed some very surprising results; the children have written up their findings in a report format.





In Meadowlark Class:

We started with a new unit of maths work on fractions, decimals and percentages this week. Sometimes this can be a really daunting topic for students but my 'Meadowlarks' took everything I threw at them in their stride and they are doing brilliantly in understanding the relationship between fractions and decimal numbers!

In English we wrote a descriptive, narrative setting; editing our work as we go along and improving our writing.

In science, we studied the earth's movement in space, understanding why we have day and night and time zones.

In PE we focused on athletics and prepared for our sports day. We threw javelins and ran with eggs and spoons to name but a few exciting activities!
