### Plover Class:

This week in Nursery we looked at books about feelings and talked about kind hands and how to be a caring friend. We have made beautiful abstract photo collages and lovely Valentines Day art work to take home. The highlight of our week has to be our stick puppets (some requested happy faces, others said they want a sad face) that we decorated and 'dressed'. It was fun playing with them and letting them 'have a go' singing songs to our friends in the puppet theatre. We enjoyed outside play in rain suits and wellies - it



would have been better if there was even more rain, so that we had puddles to jump in, but the slippery wet slide gave us plenty of entertainment!



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### Albatross Class:

This week in Albatross class we have been reading a poetry book called 'Here Come the Superheroes'.

In literacy FS1 have been listening carefully to words that start with the same letter. FS2 have been describing the different characters in the book.

In maths, FS1 have been focusing on counting objects in a set. FS2 have been comparing lengths and heights.

In expressive art and design, we have been making models for robots to link with the character 'Metal Man'.

We have had a range of magnets out this week to join together and create different items and we have also tested which items are magnetic and which are not.






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#### Caracara Class:

Caracara Class have been busy writing at length this week. The year 1s have independently and successfully written a postcard and the year 2s have produced a fact file about their imaginary island. We have come full circle with our learning about Grace Darling and rescues; we've designed our own bravery awards for R.N.L.I. members and learnt about how to call for help in the U.K.



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**Falcon Class:** What a busy week we have had! I think all of the falcons are ready for a restful half term. In maths year 4 have completed their work on perimeter and year 3 have been adding and sub-tracting lengths by first converting into the same units of measurement and then using the column method.

In English we have been looking at our new model text, a diary entry, and we are preparing to write our own when we get back after half term. We have completed our learning on the Egyptians in history

and I think the children have surprised themselves about how much they now know, compared to when we started.

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### Meadowlark Class:

The highlight of my term was our oil pastel space art because it was really exiting to do. The book that we are reading in class is Cosmic which is about a boy who takes a girl (who he is pretending is his daughter) into a rocket to space. In maths I have learnt about algebra, decimals, percentages and fractions. (If y= 6 what is 2y -8?) In cricket club I am learning to play cricket, and how to catch a ball better. This half term we have been learning about space. There are two mnemonics to learn the order of the planets: My Very Easy Method Just Speeds Up Nothing, and My Very Extraordinary Mother Just Served Us Nachos. Something challenging for me was algebra, but I managed to work it out.

I enjoyed learning about the fascinating topic of space. I liked sketching the ISS and labelling the different modules. We found out the distance of the planets from the sun. In maths I learnt about percentages and decimals. We also learnt algebra. (which are letters instead of numbers) I found some bits in algebra challenging and I overcame it by trying my hardest and not giving up. In English we wrote letters and setting descriptions. In art we learnt different techniques too, including how to use oil pastels. In science we designed our own planets and made a sun dial. In PE we played cricket.

I enjoyed making our oil pastel rockets. I have improved on my spellings and handwriting. The most interesting thing that I have learnt is algebra. In English we have been writing letters [as characters of our class book FArTHER] and writing a setting narrative. I struggled with possessive and plural noun apostrophes. In yarn club, we have been doing weaving and wrapping wool around cardboard letters. We decorated our letters with buttons and tattles. We are listening to "Cosmic," a really funny audiobook about going to space.

I learnt a lot about algebra which I found quite challenging, but I found learning about decimals much easier. I can convert fractions into decimals. I thought that our science task was fun because we went outside in the rain and made a mini solar system. I also liked creating my very own planet which I called "Positivitina." I loved playing cricket in PE, it was lots of fun.






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#### Maths Parent Workshop (Caracara, Falcon and Meadowlark Classes only)
