








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Albatross Class:

In physical play, we have all enjoyed playing "What's the time Mr Wolf"? Playing it everyday this week!

FS2 have been reading a non fiction text about wolves. They have been using their phonics to write about how they communicate, where they live and how they show their feelings.

We all looked amazing in our costumes for World Book Day!
















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Caracara Class:

Caracara class have had a lovely week immersing themselves in Traditional Tales, especially Jack and the Beanstalk. World Book Day enabled us to ask the whole school what their favourite tale is by using a tally chart to record the data. 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Falcon Class:

It has been lovely to see the class after the half-term holiday and the exciting chatter from the children has been a pleasure. Falcon Class have been investigating fractions this week, looking at numerators and denominators and what they mean in terms of the size of a fraction. They have been comparing fractions and modelling them using pictures to aid understanding. In music this week, the children learned how to compose and create their own tune on a keyboard using an interactive website, and how to write out their own music score. Our art lesson today introduced several artists who used plants as their 'subject' such as Claude Monet, Guiseppe Arcimboldo and our focus artist Georgia O'Keeffe. The children talked about what they liked and disliked about each artist's work and compared similarities and differences. The children were also lucky enough to join in with the Year 5/6 presentation by the RAF museum on forces, and made their own parachutes before testing them out.











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Meadowlark Class:

The half-term holiday seems like a far-off distant memory and we are only five weeks away from the Easter holidays!

We were again fortunate enough this week to have had several enrichment activities in Meadowlark. We had an online session with the RAF museum where our students got an introduction to 'forces' and had to make parachutes to test air resistance.






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Maths Parent Workshop (Plover and Albatross Classes only)
