
Albatross Class


Albatross class have been learning all about plants and seeds this week. We've looked at different kinds of seeds; some that we found in our fruit snack, and others that have been bought in packets. We've had a go at tasting some pumpkin and sunflower seeds (they went down surprisingly well), and we've planted some basil seeds and are now patiently waiting for them to germinate. We've also learnt that plants are living things and about what they need to survive. The children have also had fun filling pots with soil and counting and ordering seeds as part of maths this week, and in art we've used watercolours to paint our favourite plants.

Our English has begun by looking at our focus text 'The King Who Banned The Dark': a rather apt book for the upcoming coronation and the nights getting darker! 
