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#### Falcon Class:

What a busy week we have had in Falcons! In science the children have carried out a fun experiment to find out the properties of materials which insulate or conduct electricity. They did this by creating a simple series circuit, checking the components were working before adding in another item and checking to see if the circuit was complete or incomplete. They discovered that metallic objects were the best at conducting electricity.

In English, the children have completed their invention narratives which are marvellous and include useful objects such as a pill that helps you breathe underwater, a teleporter, a suction suit to help climbers and a rocket man suit to help firefighters.

In maths, the children have been adding and subtracting amounts of money and converting between pounds and pence.

In history, the children have compared some of the most famous steam engines, the Rocket, the Flying Scotsman, the Mallard and the Evening Star, looking at their designs, use and history of service on the railways.






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## Maths Parent Workshop Thursday 25th May (Caracara, Falcon and Meadowlark Classes)
