



Dear Parents

I can't quite believe that it is only 5 weeks until the end of term and another large turnover of families, after what has been a very successful year. I am delighted with the progress the children have made this year and the children should be proud of their achievements. The amount of progress the children have made is clear when you look back through previous books.

Plover Class

We have enjoyed our learning in nursery this week! Our book focus was 'The Mitten' by Jan Brett. The children really enjoyed this story and we read it more than a few times. We linked a lot of creative learning in with the text, such as, making paper bag mitten books, which can be used to retell the story at home. We also painted a mitten shaped decoration to hang and made beautiful cellophane mittens for a window display. Welcome to our new friend Alfred, who has already settled in well!



Albatross Class:

This week in Albatross, we have been using the non fiction text 'Seashore' to help support our learning. We started the week looking at and drawing our own starfish. We all made starfish out of salt dough.

In maths, FS1 have been investigating the language of numbers by counting a quantity. FS2 have been finding double numbers and adding them together to find the total.

In literacy, FS1 have been learning all about the letter 'a' and FS2 have been writing about what is found along the seashore.

We had a visit from the dental team on Tuesday and they talked to us about how to brush our teeth correctly. We practised brushing teeth after snack time and lunchtime. Thank you to Emma and Bonita for the goodie bags that they gave everyone.



Caracara Class:

This week, Caracaras have started a new book for English called 'Tidy' by Emily Gravett. We are loving the illustrations and the environmental message that the book provides. We have been talking about past tense verbs and year 2s have been improving their vocabulary whilst changing adjectives into adverbs using the suffix -ly. In maths, year 1s have started looking at fractions. We do not use the fraction notation this year, but work hard at using the vocabulary of half and quarters, groups and sharing. Year 2s have enjoyed learning about statistics using block diagrams and pictograms of different scales. This links also with the whole class' investigation into the amount of rainfall during the winter months. As you can see, Mondays seem to have less rainfall, although we have to improve the graph as this week there was 65ml of rain in the 24-hour period! We have also enjoyed practising spellings with Spelling Shed this week.



Falcon Class:

Mrs Grindlay will be absent from MPS from 23rd June until 4th July (airbridge permitting). Mr Moore will be the teacher in Falcon Class until her return.

This week Falcons have been busy making BFSAI gnomes for the Mid Winter fair. We have welcomed a new pupil, Autumn, into the class and the children have had a lot of fun getting to know her and help her settle in. In our maths lessons we are continuing learning about digital time and converting minutes into hours, days and weeks.

In English, we have started to look at our new text 'Starbird' and have made predictions about what the book might contain.

We also started with planning our stall for the winter fair on Monday, 26th June. We will be selling popcorn, sock penguins, slime, mocktails, old toys and books. There will also be a 'nerf the teacher' area for people to have a bit of fun.
