
It was great fun joining in with KS1 and KS2 this morning as they created their Falkland Island inspired pictures using the technique and skill of wet felting.

Our topic this week, has been very much interest-led as the children have been enjoying pretend games involving dogs/pets.

They have also loved building puzzles and been asking for them daily, so we ensured there were plenty prepared, including some which supported the development of their fine-motor skills.

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Albatross Class:

This week in Albatross Class

In maths FS2 have been learning to count in twos. They have used compare bears, coins and number lines to help them.

In literacy, our text focus has been 'The Storm Whale'. FS2 have been writing sentences about the book and were able to retell the story in pictures, and then writing their own account of the story. FS1 have been able to talk about the story, sequence it and draw pictures to show different parts of the story.

In creative development this week, we have been busy creating boats to help a character from the story release a whale. We created our boats out of junk modelling materials and then tested them in the water tray to see if they would float. We looked at Cape Pembroke lighthouse, which is in Stanley, and created lighthouses out of different construction materials.

We spent some time at the play park next to the school to use the equipment and play some games.

All children that are moving on, have had some 1-1 time to talk about their transition to their new school. We have looked at school websites, uniform and talked about the photos of the schools that the children will be going to.
















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
Caracara Class:



We wrote a book review about each one and each book gained high praise.


Why not read an Emily Gravett story, as a family, by taking one out from the library?













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Falcon Class:

In science this week, the children have carried out an experiment to test the relationship between the height an object is dropped, and the amount of volume it creates. They worked together to plan the experiment before writing up their results and plotting them on a line graph.

"We found out that the higher the weight was dropped from, the louder the sound it makes" - Cruz.

In maths, Year 4 have completed their unit on statistics and are starting position and direction, whilst year 3 are completing their work on shape.

In English this week, the children have written independent stories ranging from fairy tales to the apocalypse, which have been a pleasure to read. I was pleased to see so many of the grammatical features taught this year included in them.

In art, Falcons have been collecting colours and images from magazines, newspapers and photographs, to create their collage images of animals in captivity which has proved to be a very messy task! They have also enjoyed a fabulous Friday designing and creating a Falklands landscape from wet felt, along with the rest of KS1 and KS2.









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Meadowlark Class:

In maths this week, we have continued to revise 'tricky' topics from earlier this year, including percentages and fractions.

In English this week, we've revised main, subordinating, coordinating and relative clauses. We have also worked hard on completing our leaver's assembly presentations and wrote goodbye cards for everyone.
