There has been lots of exciting learning happening in school this week, from work around the story of 'Mr Big', plants in science, Stone Age cave paintings and WW1. It has been great to see the children so engaged in their learning.

We are delighted that the Head of Defence Children Services, Ms Beverley Martin (Bev) and the Assistant Chief Education Officer Rest of World, Mr Rowland Bucknill (Rowley) will be visiting the Falklands and MPS from the morning of 10th October to the 13th October 2023, to find out more about MPC and the school provision. **In Albatross Class:** In Albatross class, it was lovely to welcome back our friend Kusang this week and see our classroom getting busier! Lots of working together and playing alongside friends which is great to see.

Our story focus was 'Mr Big' and at the end of the week, we had a go at creating our own 'versions' of him using pens and paint sticks. Mr Big also bought a piano in the story, so on Friday morning, we explored the mini keyboards in class. It was lots of fun making music and having a little dance to our musical creations.

In maths, we were continuing to spot matching pairs and began comparing amounts working out when there were more, fewer or equal amounts. We enjoyed threading too using pasta and string – it was tricky to thread but we persevered! Great job Albatross class.

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In Caracara Class: This week Caracara class have continued to record the growth of their plants, and are waiting patiently for the weather to warm up slightly so that we can re-pot them outside. In science, we reinforced our understanding of flower and tree terminology by creating large 'diagrams' and labelled the key features. The year 2s have continued with place value in maths, by flexibly partitioning numbers to 100 thinking about how to partition the tens and ones in different ways. Everyone has worked hard at developing their understanding of conjunctions in English this week. We have continued to use our Learning Chart which the children are becoming more autonomous with now.






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#### In Falcon Class:

The children have had a busy week revising their place value knowledge and are beginning their addition and subtraction topic. In English, they have learned how to use a/an, written a play script and turned the play script into a short extract, using inverted commas and rules for direct speech. In history the children have learned about Skara Brae and how life changed from the Mesolithic hunter gathering, to a Neolithic farming community. They looked at evidence from the site and thought about what this evidence can tell us about their way of life. We also created a cave, lit by firelight, so that the children could try their hand at making their own cave art using natural products such as berries, plants and charcoal. Some found it very difficult to create a painting and they made comparisons between the pictures created at their desks, and those in their cave, giving them a real appreciation of what amazing artists the Stone Age people were.







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#### In Meadowlark Class:

In English this week, we wrote and described a WW1 battle scene, focusing on the use of onomatopoeia, similes and personification. In maths, we learnt how to do column addition and subtraction, whilst solving word problems.

In science, we looked at the foetal development of babies. In history, we learnt about the fascinating WW1 naval battle that took place off the coast of Port Stanley in 1914.
