Dear Parents


The learning environments throughout the school, enable the children to enthusiastically engage with their learning, which they do with excitement and wonder.

This week, we have been busy exploring capacity using different sized containers. We first filled them with different amounts and described what we saw. FS2 enjoyed exploring pattern and making their own patterns using anything they could find in the classroom. On Thursday, we enjoyed making careful observations and measurements of our plants. Today, we've worked extremely hard at retelling our story so that we're ready to write on Monday.







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In Falcon Class:

Our science learning has focussed on the human skeleton, naming the main bones and learning the functions of each. The children made their own skeletons to label and built the human skeleton, using our fabulous resources. They learned how bones can regenerate themselves and how to keep their skull safe when riding their bikes or skateboards. In computing, the children have been making their own soundtrack by layering musical instruments to include a beat, melody and lyrics. The children played their finished pieces to the class and discussed the good points and where they could be improved. In English, the children worked in pairs to give each other instruction on how to draw an animal. They learned that precise instructions are essential!







In Meadowlark Class:

In English this week, we wrote informal letters from the perspective of a WW1 soldier, using a range of literary devices.

In maths, we concluded our unit on how to do long multiplication and solved a selection of multi-step word problems.

In science, we learnt about puberty and the physical changes people go through as they grow older. In history, we learnt about the role of animals during WW1. Our favourite story is definitely about the courageous Sergeant Stubby, a wandering mongrel, that saved the lives of countless soldiers.

In art, we learnt about colour mixing and using different shades to blend paint.
