Falcon Class:

This week has flown by with a flurry of exciting learning taking place. In maths the children have been learning how to accurately measure in mm, CM and M and Year 4 have learned how to measure the perimeter of irregular and regular polygons. In English, the children have almost completed writing their escape from Pompeii stories which include all of the grammar learning from across the term. In science, the children have looked at how fossils are formed and looked at an actual fossil of a trilobite donated by Mrs Kavanagh-Hogg. They have also learned how soil is formed from rocks and named the different layers from bedrock to topsoil. In history, the children investigated the main reasons why the Romans wanted to invade Britain and discussed whether the reasons were justified or not. Finally, some of the children completed their mosaic plates by grouting the gaps between the tiling and discovered just how fiddly and messy it is!
