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Falcon Class:

In Falcons this week we have been completing our newspaper articles about sighting a rare animal in the ocean and perfecting our layout. In maths, Yr 3 have been looking at equivalent fractions and Yr 4 have been looking at how to write numbers to two decimal places. Our KS2 art projects are coming along and the children have started to layer the recycled plastics to create their 'image' representing the pollution and its effects on the wildlife. In science the children have looked at how human activity affects our rivers and what can be done to rectify the situation. The children are doing really well with their times table practice and several certificates have been achieved this week.

Y5 Meadowlarks have been learning how to calculate area and perimeter of compound shapes, with our Y6 Meadowlark, moving through area and perimeter onto volume.
