This week saw us completing our setting narratives based on the book FArTHER - every-one has produced some wonderful pieces of writing with some excellent handwriting! Well done Orca class - keep up the hard work with this.

We also enjoyed exploring the Ancient Egyptian artefact box which was purchased thanks to a grant from BFBS (thank you once again!). In our history lesson, we discussed how we could know so much about the ancient civilisation despite the fact it ended so many years ago! We found out more about sources of evidence discussing the difference between primary and secondary sources. We then used our historical skills to see if we could infer or deduce meaning from images of artefacts before checking our ideas against the facts. This took some great observation skill as some of them were particularly obscure. We finished our history session learning a bit more about Howard Carter and his discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb in the Valley of the Kings.














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Orcas - Computing Collage

sutured her own face!
