Well done to Siana Y3, Immy Y5 and Joanna FS2, for achieving their Star Award! Well deserved for super and continued efforts.



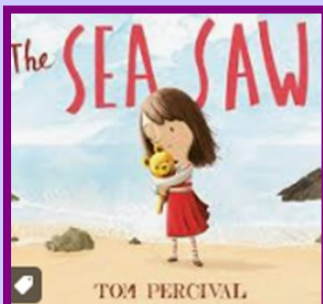
Farewell!

News from Commerson Class...



This week the year 1 and 2 children have started to learn French! Before learning to say a few greetings, we talked about where France is, its capital city and a few landmarks. We enjoyed learning to say hello to one another in two different ways and how to say what our names are.



The FS2s have focused on the book, 'The Sea Saw' this week. It's a beautiful story about how a young girl loses her teddy and the sea tries to give it back to the owner. The owner is an elderly lady by the time she receives it!

The FS2s went outside to think about the bear's journey and the different feelings both physically and emotionally it may have felt along its way.

We were all amazed at how tall our sunflowers are growing. We looked at the centre and learnt that the seeds from the flower's centre will become like those that we planted to grow the sunflower!

And in Orca Class ...

Space has been the theme that seemed to be running through everything this week! We started on Monday engaging with a 'live' BBC Teach lesson online which had us thinking about life on the International Space Station and was one of our events this week focussing on STEM. We very much enjoyed having Josh (RAF STEM ambassador) in school too on Tuesday 11th March who challenged us to think carefully and logically, whilst encouraging self-reflection and improvement!

We completed the final touches on our space collages, making up our own mnemonics to remember the order of the planets. We also went to the field to measure out a scaled down version of the solar system. We began with the sun and measured out distances to see quite how spread out the planets are...we couldn't believe the distance on the field and then had to try and imagine what this was representative of in space itself! As an example, we measured Neptune to be 112.5 metres away from the sun using a scale of 1 metre to every 40 million kilometres... In reality, Neptune is around 4.5 billion kilometres away from the sun! This prompted lots of discussion as well as some interesting questions! A great busy week in Orca class!
