News from Orca Class

It has been a very busy fortnight in Orca class and we are in full swing with all of our different units. In geography, we are enjoying creating our own 'project books' as we complete a study on South America, with a spotlight on Brazil. Our English unit is all about dilemmas and based upon our key book 'King Kong'. We enjoyed acting out two contrasting characters this week as part of our learning one was determined and the other was cautious. There are some very dramatic actors amongst our class, and we all enjoyed seeing each other's interpretations of the dilemma.
