### Orca news

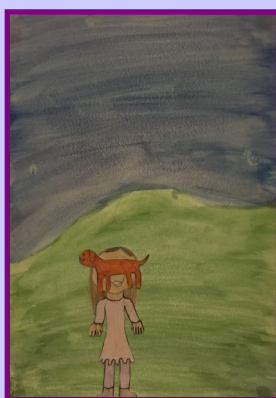

4 days to go Orca Class - I look forward to our final week together before we enjoy a well-deserved break!





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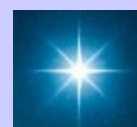
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## Star Awards

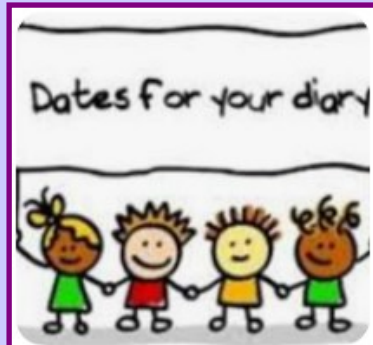
